Shore excursion program and itineraries may vary depending on local conditions and/or any unforeseen events in relation to the timing on the day of the tour and / or subject to change based on local regulations or other restrictions.

Kindly note that prices are also subject to change any time. Please also note that MSC has the right to cancel/change the excursion booked at any time.

SANTORINI (Greece)

JTR01 – OIA VILLAGE

Duration: approx. 4 hours

A short tender boat ride from the ship will take you to Athinios port where we will board a bus to Oia, a typical Greek village characterized by narrow streets, traditional white churches with blue domes – a picture-postcard vision of the Mediterranean! This village is famous for its hill-top location which offers a breathtaking view over the Gulf of Santorini. Enjoy a short guided walk followed by approx. 45 minutes free time before boarding the coach and reach a nearby winery where delights of a different kind are in store. Sample local delicacies made of cheese, tomatoes, olives, and bread accompanied by a delicious wine tasting session. Next on your list is the small town of Fira, located in the west of the island and perched on a cliff 260 metres above sea level. You will have free time to discover the narrow streets of the town where the predominant colour is white and blue; don't forget your camera because every corner of Fira is a great place to take panoramic pictures. Near the Orthodox Cathedral you will say goodbye to your guide, but not before being told how to take the cable car back to the port of Fira. From the port, a boat will take you to the ship. *Please note: there may be long queues at the cable car station or to pick up the tender boat. As the ship stays at anchor, the transfer to and from the island takes place on tender boats. The tour includes walking on cobblestone streets with steps and is unsuitable for guests with walking difficulties. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion. The order of the visits may change to avoid crowds at the venue; rotation of the groups can happen at the winery so wine tasting may also take place early in the morning. The cable car ticket is included in the price of the tour.*

JTR02 – SANTORINI CALDERA, VOLCANO & HOT SPRINGS

Duration: approx. 3 hours

Sail through the "Caldera", the Gulf of Santorini, to the tiny, uninhabited island of Nea Kameni. The island is home to a volcano which we will visit during a walking tour and which enriches the waters around the island. More islands are in store as we continue to Palea Kameni where our boat will anchor for about 30 minutes so you can swim from the boat in the warm, sulphuric waters. You then return to Skala port to board a tender boat back to your cruise ship. *Please note: the excursion operates from June until the end of September and is subject to weather conditions. Depending on the boat's position, you might swim for a while in open sea to reach the hot springs. This tour is for guests who can swim and is not suitable for guests with mobility, heart, or asthma problems. We recommend wearing comfortable, closed shoes and a hat and bringing sunscreen.*

JTR03 – RELAX AT PERIVOLOS BEACH

Duration: approx. 4 hours

Your relaxing beach experience begins with a short trip on a tender boat to Athinios port, after which a coach will take you to Perivolos Beach, a picturesque stretch of sand giving onto the beautiful blue of the Aegean Sea. You will have some time to enjoy beach life and the various taverns, pubs, and restaurants you will also find along the seafront. The rest of your trip will be in Fira, the capital of the island of Santorini where you can opt to have some free time in town or return to the ship on your own. You will be given instructions on how to reach the Orthodox Church and how to take the cable car back down to the port of Fira, where you will pick up your tender boat to return to the ship. *Please note: the excursion operates from June until the end of September and is subject to weather conditions. The price of hiring sun loungers and parasols at the beach is not included in the price of the excursion. As the ship stays at anchor, the transfer to and from the island takes place on tender boats. There may be long queues at the cable car station or to board the tender boat. The cable car ticket is included in the price of the tour.*



JTR05 – BEST OF SANTORINI

Duration: approx. 7.5 hours

Exciting, exclusive, edifying: three attributes that not only aptly describe this tour, but also the Greek island of Santorini itself, which was created when the crater left by a huge volcanic eruption collapsed, leaving only the rim, a so-called caldera. After a short boat ride to Athinios port, you will continue by coach to explore the island's history, capital, and dramatic landscape. First up is ancient Akrotiri, a town that flourished during the Minoan Bronze Age, but then fell victim to a major volcanic outbreak that covered it ash in the middle of the 2nd millennium B.C.. Since excavation work began in 1967, many extremely well-preserved artefacts have been uncovered, including frescoes and even some three-storey buildings. You will have about 1.15 hours to enjoy this prehistoric site before you move on to Fira, Santorini's capital, for more free time to spend as you please. The pretty lanes are fun to walk down, the cafés great for a pit-stop and the views of the Kamenis, twin volcanic islets in the bay, spectacular. Last up is Oia, a blue-and-white village in Cycladic style perched on the very edge of the caldera. After a guided walk through its pretty cobbled streets, a stop at a local winery will give you a chance to sample local delicacies made of cheese, tomatoes, olives and bread accompanied by a delicious wine tasting session. Next, board your coach to reach Athinios port where a motorboat awaits to take you back to the ship. *Please note: as this tour involves walking on cobbled streets with steps, it is unsuitable for guests with walking difficulties. The order of the visits may change to avoid crowds at the venue; rotation of the groups can happen at the winery so wine tasting may also take place early in the morning. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. As the ship stays at anchor, the transfer to and from the island takes place on tender boats. There may be some queues at the parking area to take the bus to the port and to embark on the motorboat back to the ship.*



JTR07 – OIA VILLAGE & BEACH

Duration: approx. 6 hours, 15 minutes, light lunch included

Blue skies and sunshine, breathtaking views and time to relax on a stunning beach make great reasons to join this leisurely tour of Santorini. After a short tender boat transfer to Athinios port, a coach will take you past Fira and the village of Imerovigli en route to Oia at the northern end of the island. Teetering on the crest of the volcanic caldera, the village affords glorious views of the bay and the Aegean Sea. A 30-minute guided walk is followed by some additional 30-minute free time for you to spend in Oia, exploring its pretty lanes, enjoying the blue and white of its Cycladic architecture, going shopping or stopping for a rest at one of the enticing cafés. Moving on, you'll then head south to the striking black-pebble beach at Perivolos. Served by a varied infrastructure, the tranquil beach surroundings are perfect for doing whatever you like. Your approx. 3.5-hour stay will include a complimentary umbrella and sunbed as well as free snacks and drinks served exclusively for you at a nearby beach-front café. But facilities for windsurfing, jet-skiing and scuba diving are also available, the cost of which is not covered by the price of the tour. Next, you will reach Athinios port where a motorboat awaits to take you back to the ship. *Please note: there may be long queues to pick up the tender boat. As the ship stays at anchor, the transfer to and from the island takes place on tender boats. This tour includes walking on cobblestone streets with steps so is unsuitable for guests with walking difficulties. The excursion operates from June until the end of September, is subject to weather conditions. 1 sunbed per adult available. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call.*



JTR08 – 4X4 ADVENTURE IN SANTORINI

Duration: approx. 4 hours

Join us on this excursion combining fun, adventure and Santorini's wild landscapes enabling you to spend a few hours exploring this lovely island in a completely different way. A short tender boat ride from the ship will take you to Athinios port where we board a bus to the location where your 4x4 jeeps await you. Board the vehicle and start your adventure driving to Akrotiri, located on the southern end of the island, an amazing lunar landscape created by the last eruption of the volcano. You'll then drive to Vlihada beach, where you will have a short break to jump in the cool waters of the Aegean Sea or to simply enjoy the views. The natural beauty of this secluded beach, framed by pumice stone hills, will enchant you. Next destination is the traditional village of Pyrgos for an opportunity to taste typical Greek snack at a local restaurant. Continue to the mountain of Profitis Elias, the highest of the island (550 m) with an incredible panoramic view of Santorini; be certain to have your camera ready for your memory book. Then take a road drive passing by the villages of Exo Gonia, Kamari and Monolithos. Your destination will be the capital of the island, Fira. Here you'll have free time to stroll through the city and admire the beautiful views of the caldera before taking the cable car down to the port of Fira to return by tender boat to the ship. *Please note: the tour is self-drive only; guests wishing to drive must be 21 years old, be in possession of a valid international driving licence, which they must have held for at least two years. Each 4x4 can accommodate a maximum of 4 guests, incl. the driver. If you travel with your family or friends, we cannot guarantee you will be in the same 4x4, depending on the available space as all vehicles must be occupied for its entire capacity. Min. age to take part: 4 years. Moreover, only 1 guest per 4x4 will drive the vehicle. The tour is unsuitable for pregnant women and guests with back/neck problems. Vehicles all feature a manual gearbox; the driver must know how to operate a manual gearbox and be capable of starting the vehicle on an incline. Guests must sign a waiver before taking part in the tour. Periods of driving will not be narrated, but information will be given at the various stops by your guide. No changing facilities or showers are available on the beach. All vehicles are fully insured with a Collision Damage Waiver (CDW), excess according to the vehicle rental contract's terms and conditions. As the ship stays at anchor, the transfer to and from the island takes place on tender boats. The cable car ticket is included in the price of the tour. There may be long queues at the cable car station or to pick up the tender boat. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call.*

JTR17 – DISCOVER THE WONDERS OF SANTORINI



Duration: approx. 3 hours

Leaving the ship, don't forget your camera. This half-day excursion will allow you to enrich your personal photo gallery by alternating stops at panoramic viewpoints with guided walks to the towns of Megalochori and Fira. After a boat transfer to the port of Athinios, you will find your coach and guide to begin your exploration of Santorini. Reach the first viewpoint giving you the opportunity to admire the caldera wall which is the typical rocky cliff towards Fira, and beyond the volcano to Oia. Board the coach again and continue with a panoramic drive passing through picturesque small villages, vineyards and enjoying dramatic views of sea, land, and sky all the way to Profitis Elias Mountain, the next viewpoint. The highest spot of the island (567 meters) is located between Pyrgos and Kamari. The Mountain's name, Profitis Ilias (Prophet Elijah), is coming from the Monastery with the same name on its peak. From this vantage point, you will enjoy a striking view of the entire island, from the patchwork agricultural plains to the hilltop village of Oia. You will then visit the village of Megalochori which means "great village". Its existence is recorded back to the 17th century. Enjoy a short guided walk along its historical mansions, old traditional houses, pirate hideaways and wineries; the village has a history of merchants and wealthy land barons exporting wines of unique taste that the island still produces. Your last stop will be at the village of Fira, near the Metropolis Church, from where the guide will instruct you on how to take the cable car down the port before leaving you at your independent exploration. *Please note: there may be long queues at the cable car station or to pick up the tender boat. This tour includes tender embarkation/disembarkation and walking on cobblestone streets with steps so is not suitable for guests with walking difficulties. The cable car ticket is included in the price of the tour.*

MYKONOS (Greece)

MYK04 – DELOS: THE ISLAND OF GREEK MYTHOLOGY



Duration: approx. 3.5 hours

Situated in the middle of the Cyclades Group lies Delos, the "Island of Light", and the destination of this enjoyable tour. After a short boat trip, your exploration of Delos' historical remains and rich mythology can begin. Legend has it that Zeus took a shine to the beautiful Leto, in the course of which affair she fell pregnant. However, this drew the ire of Zeus' wife, Hera, who promptly forbade Mother Earth to give Leto refuge. Just when all hope seemed to be lost, a serendipitous island - Delos - rose out of the sea, giving Leto a safe haven to deliver twins Artemis and Apollo. Popular as a pilgrimage site among ancient Grecians, Delos became one of the wealthiest

shrines of antiquity. Among the remains of this era is the Avenue of Lions, so named for a row of originally 7th-century Naxian-marble lions that seem to guard the spot where Leto is said to have given birth. You can then crown your exceptional experience by taking the path up to Mount Cynthos, from whose peak Zeus is said to have watched the birth of his twins. Do not let the uphill hike deter you, for the mind-blowing view from the peak is worth every step. Round out your visit by exploring some of the numerous other monuments at the site before beginning your return journey to your port. *Please note: this tour includes approximately 1.5 hours of walking, at times over uneven surfaces. Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part.*



MYK05 – MYKONOS ISLAND TOUR

Duration: approx. 3.5 hours

Venture out and uncover the many different facets of Mykonos island, the "St. Tropez of Greece". Just how much the island has to offer is yours to discover on this relaxing and mainly coach-based tour, which begins with a drive to the so-called Panorama vantage point. A photo stop will give you a chance to capture beguiling views of Mykonos town and the old port, before a scenic route will take you through the picturesque villages of Agios Ioannis and Kalafatis as well as past the cosmopolitan beach of Ornos. A stop will be made at the heart of Mykonos to visit the island's second-largest settlement, the village of Ano Mera, at whose centre stands the monastery and church of Panagia Tourliani. Probably founded at some time during the 16th-century and then remodelled in 1767, the cloister is a major draw for travellers visiting the area. A generous helping of warm Greek hospitality then awaits you in a village taverna, giving you a chance to reflect on your day of Mykonian magic as you relax to the aniseed flavour of ouzo and the savoury goodness of typical Greek appetizers. More pleasing views can then be enjoyed during the return drive to the port and your ship. *Please note: Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. Guests are requested to wear appropriate attire for religious visits. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call.*



MYK08 – A NIGHT OUT IN MYKONOS

Duration: approx. 3.5 hours

Fabulous beaches, a windmill-dotted landscape, friendly locals and a particularly lively night-time clubbing scene have all gone to make Mykonos the popular holiday destination it is today. This tour will see you leave the ship, hop on a seabus for a short trip to the old port to enjoy an evening of Greek hospitality and a light dinner in a restaurant. In addition to delicious local specialities and wine, you will also get to enjoy a folkloric show while at the restaurant. You can even join in yourself and shake a leg or, if you prefer, simply clap in time with the music. The tour also includes a guided walk around the narrow lanes of Mykonos town, full of whitewashed houses and enclosed gardens. At the end of the tour, you can either return to the ship straight away or spend more time in "Chora", as locals call the town, until you feel ready to call it a night and make your own way back to the ship by shuttle boat. *Please note: the price of the tour includes water and 1 glass of wine during light dinner; no dessert included. As the tour involves a longer period of walking, it is unsuitable for guests with walking difficulties. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. This tour is available only for guests on MSC Divina, MSC Musica (except on 07.11.2023), MSC Armonia and on following dates of MSC Splendida: 07.07.2023, 12.08.2023 and 14.10.2023.*



MYK11 – SAILING TRIP AROUND MYKONOS' FAMOUS BEACHES

Duration: approx. 4.5 hours

Next to an amazing nightlife, cosmopolitan atmosphere and beautiful landscape, Mykonos is also home to a slew of gorgeous beaches, some of which you will be discovering by boat on this appealing half-day tour. Only a short coach ride from the pier will see you reach Agios Ioannis, from where a local kind of boat known as a caïque will take you on a sun-kissed sail around the island's southern coastline. Feel the breeze in your hair and soak up the views as you pass Ornos, Psarou, Platis Gialos, Paranga and Super Paradise beaches – some of the best on the island. Depending on the weather, swimming stops are also scheduled in the vicinity of selected beaches, so it's worth having your swimwear on under your clothes. A chance to go ashore at Paradise beach and enjoy the facilities also forms part of the outing, as do delicious cold Greek snacks on board the caïque as you make your way home. *Please note: the tour runs from June to September, depends on weather conditions and is unsuitable for guests with walking difficulties. Guests are recommended to wear swimwear under clothes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, and towels.*

Beach stops are not scheduled (except for a stop at Paradise beach), but swimming will be possible directly from the caique. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call.



MYK12 – ISLAND TOUR AND TIME AT THE BEACH

Duration: approx. 6.5 hours

A chance to explore the lovely Greek island of Mykonos and spend some time on a sunny beach awaits you on this appealing outing, which begins with a coach-based roundup of the island's best sights. After passing Ornos beach, you'll continue on to Agios Ioannis where you can catch views of Delos island in the distance. You'll ultimately be heading for the island's interior and the village of Ano Mera, home to the monastery and church of Panagia Tourliani. You'll visit the beautiful old complex - built in the 16th, then remodelled in the 18th-century - before making your way to one of the village tavernas for Greek appetizers with a shot of ouzo, the Greeks' national aniseed tippie, or a soft drink. Next up is the journey to the beach at Kalafati, where you'll then have about 2.5 hours to enjoy sun, sea, and sand. The crystal-clear water is an open invitation to go swimming, the beach perfect for catching the sun or enjoying a walk along the shoreline. When the time comes, the coach will be waiting to take you to Mykonos town, which, despite its small size, is one of the most cosmopolitan towns of the Aegean. Enjoy a pleasant walking tour through the narrow, winding streets and discover some of the area's most treasured landmarks. At the end of your guided stroll, you can either return to the ship straight away or spend more time in "Chora", as locals call the town, until you feel ready to make your own way back to the ship. *Please note: the price of the tour does not include use of sunbeds or umbrellas at the beach. However, they can be rented, subject to availability. Guests are recommended to wear swimwear under their clothes, to bring a hat, high-factor sunscreen, and towels and to wear appropriate attire for religious visits. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. The tour runs from June to September and depends on weather conditions. This tour is available for guests on MSC Armonia, MSC Sinfonia, on following dates of MSC Splendida: 08.06.2023, 17.06.2023, 23.07.2023, 19.08.2023 and 24.09.2023 and on following dates of MSC Divina: 27.06.2023, 04.07.2023, 11.07.2023 and 05.09.2023.*



MYK19 – SEA & SUN AT KALAFATI BEACH

Duration: approx. 4 hours

Nestling in a secluded cove on the southern shoreline of Mykonos lies one of the island's longest beaches - Kalafati - and your destination on this appealing half-day seaside treat. Pop your swimwear on under your clothes, leave the ship and spend a mere 30 minutes on a coach to reach the idyllic setting, perfect for some serious relaxation on pristine sand while lounging on a sunbed. The shallow and crystal-clear Aegean Sea is an open invitation to paddle or swim, whereas the many tavernas that flank the beach make an ideal spot to savour the views with a refreshing drink in hand (at the guests' expenses). You will have about 3 hours to enjoy the beach whichever way you like before the coach then returns you to the ship. *Please note: sunbeds (one each adult) and umbrellas will be available for use free of charge at the beach; children will share sunbeds with adults. The tour runs from June to September and depends on weather conditions. Guests are recommended to bring a hat, sunscreen, and towels.*



MYK19 – SEA & SUN AT KALAFATI BEACH

Duration: approx. 4 hours

Nestling in a secluded cove on the southern shoreline of Mykonos lies one of the island's longest beaches - Kalafati - and your destination on this appealing half-day seaside treat. Pop your swimwear on under your clothes, leave the ship and spend a mere 30 minutes on a coach to reach the idyllic setting, perfect for some serious relaxation on pristine sand while lounging on a sunbed. The shallow and crystal-clear Aegean Sea is an open invitation to paddle or swim, whereas the many tavernas that flank the beach make an ideal spot to savour the views with a refreshing drink in hand (at the guests' expenses). You will have about 3 hours to enjoy the beach whichever way you like before the coach then returns you to the ship. *Please note: sunbeds (one each adult) and umbrellas will be available for use free of charge at the beach; children will share sunbeds with adults. CIV02 – ROME, BAROQUE TOUR CIVITAVECCHIA (Italy)

CIV02 – ROME, BAROQUE TOUR

Duration: approx. 9 hours, lunch not included

Rome - one of the world's most iconic cities, steeped in history and rich in Italian charm - awaits you after an approx. 1.5-hour coach drive from Civitavecchia. A city guide will be on hand to meet you on arrival and then escort you on a coach sightseeing Roman tour that includes external viewing of Caracalla's Baths, the Circus Maximus, the Colosseum, Constantine's Arch, and the Palatino. Next, leave the coach and enjoy a 1.5-hour walk on an itinerary that includes Fontana di Trevi, the Pantheon - one of Rome's best-preserved ancient Roman temples - and Roman Baroque Piazza Navona. After some time to have lunch on your own, you will reach San Pietro area with the splendid Bernini Column: you will have 1-hour free time to explore on your own or to visit the Basilica - your guide will provide information on the site beforehand. The excursion ends with a coach drive back to Civitavecchia after saying goodbye to your guide in Rome. *Please note: The cost of the lunch (optional) is not included in the price of the tour. There may be long queues to enter St. Peter's Basilica, and it may close at short notice for reasons beyond MSC's control. The opportunity to visit the site during your free time will be reconfirmed during your cruise. Guests using a wheelchair are welcome to participate in this tour but should be aware that it includes long periods of walking, that they must be accompanied by a paying helper to assist with getting on and off the coach, and that wheelchairs must be collapsible/foldable, as the coach has neither a ramp nor a lift. Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. Guests are requested to wear appropriate attire for religious visits. It may be dusk in autumn or winter while visiting some of the sites. **This tour is not available for guests on MSC Divina except on 09.06.2023.***

CIV03 – ROME ON YOUR OWN

Duration: approx. 9 hours, lunch not included

This unguided tour of Rome begins with an approx. 1.5-hour drive by coach, after which you can spend the entire day exploring "The Eternal City" - the capital of Italy - at your leisure. You will receive instructions on how best to get around town and a map showing the main sights and monuments. Some of the must-sees Rome is known for include the Colosseum and the Roman Forum, the Pantheon, the beautiful Piazza Navona in old Rome and the neighbouring Vatican City State in Rome's modern centre, to name but a few. As one of the world's fashion capitals, the city is also choc-full of superb shopping facilities. Further sights include the magnificent Bernini Column on St. Peter's Square, which is also the site of the Pope's Sunday Angelus. *Please note: the bus stops near "Piazza del Popolo"; this is the point of arrival and departure of your tour. The cost of the lunch (optional) is not included in the price of the tour. This tour is not available for guests on MSC Divina except on 09.06.2023.*

CIV07 – GRAN TOUR OF ROME, THE ETERNAL CITY

Duration: approx. 9 hours, lunch included

This excursion combines two of the most important aspects of Rome: Christianity and antiquity. Bus transfer to Rome (1.5 hours) to meet our guide and start the tour with an inside visit to the Colosseum, also known as the Flavian Amphitheatre. We will look around this impressive edifice, built to hold up to 50.000 people and where the Romans used to watch the cruel gladiators' combats. The tour continues with a stroll around Trevi Fountain, Piazza Navona and the Pantheon, an ancient temple built in honour of seven important Roman deities. Stop for lunch in a typical Italian restaurant. The afternoon will be for the home of Christianity as we pay a visit to St. Peter's Square: free time to explore the square or to visit the Basilica independently after receiving information from the guide outside the site. After leaving our guide in Rome, we will return to the port. *Please note: Guests using a wheelchair are welcome to participate in this tour but should be aware that it is completely on foot, that they must be accompanied by a paying helper to assist with getting on and off the coach, and that wheelchairs must be collapsible/foldable, as the coach has neither a ramp nor a lift. Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. St. Peter's Basilica and the Colosseum have ramps for wheelchair users. It may be dusk in autumn and winter while visiting some of the sites. Guests are requested to wear appropriate attire for religious visits. 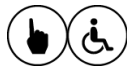
CIV08 – ROME & THE WONDERS OF THE VATICAN MUSEUM

CIV09 – ROME SIGHTSEEING



Duration: approx. 5.5 hours

The origins of Tuscania goes back to the myth and legends; some want the town to be founded by Hercules' son, some others by Aeneas' son, Ascanius. Your excursion will begin with a 50-minute coach drive across the beautiful landscape until reaching the village of Tuscania. Enjoy a guided walking tour of its historical centre, surrounded by medieval walls and marvel at the view from the Tower of Lavello. Your guide will point out the village's main sights including the Church of Saint Peter; a unique opportunity to feel the atmosphere of central Italy's little villages. Next, after boarding your coach again, you will drive to Tarquinia, one of the 12 Etruscan cities in the past. CIV47 – ROME, ST. PETER'S SQUARE & THE PAPAL ANGELUS



Duration: approx. 8 hours, lunch not included

An all-day date with the Eternal City awaits you on this outing, which begins with a relaxing 1.5-hour coach ride from the port. On arrival, you'll meet your guide and embark on a sightseeing route that includes the Pyramid of Cestius, the Baths of Caracalla, the ancient chariot racing stadium Circus Maximus, the city centre, and a photo stop at the Colosseum. You'll then take your leave of Rome and move on to Vatican City, where you can attend the Pope's Sunday Angelus on St. Peter's Square if you wish. Your guide will provide you with some information on the square and its splendid obelisk, after which you'll have about 2 hours to explore on your own. Get your Papal blessing at the Angelus or use the time to have lunch (at extra cost). Next up, you'll find yourself taking a stroll along the banks of the River Tiber and crossing the St. Angelo Bridge to reach Piazza Navona, one of Rome's most beautiful, and then passing the Pantheon before you re-board the coach for the unguided return journey to the port. *Please note: The "Angelus" depends on the Vatican's programmes. This tour is available only on Sunday. The cost of the lunch (optional) is not included in the price of the tour. This tour is not available on 28.05.2023 (MSC Seashore).*

CIV72 – DISCOVERING THE "CASTELLI ROMANI"



Duration: approx. 9 hours, lunch not included

After a 110-minute drive, meet the guide at the gates of Rome and proceed the journey to the Roman Castles, a wonderful green region with 17 villages on the hills overlooking the Eternal City. The first stop will be the city of Frascati, dominated by the majesty of Villa Aldobrandini summer residence of the noble family built for the Cardinal Pietro nephew of Pope Clemens VIII in the XVI century. A beautiful view of the Eternal City from the terrace of the main square, the Baroque Cathedral of St. Peter's and the narrow streets of the village will be the highlights of a guided walking tour. After this, a 15 minutes drive will take you to the village of Castel Gandolfo, summer residence of the Popes since 1623 and once Villa of the Roman Emperor Domiziano. The main square, facing the Papal building, overlooking Lake Albano, and affording great views, is also decorated with a fountain designed by the Master Gianlorenzo Bernini. The village also holds several shops selling souvenirs, craft, and food so you will have free time to have lunch or taste an ice cream or other specialities. Leaving Castel Gandolfo behind, next destination is the village of Nemi, once theatre of religious rites dating back to Emperor Caligula, and now renowned for flowers and wild strawberries and the beautiful volcanic lake below. After a stroll along its narrow streets and flowered Piazza overlooking the lake, enjoy some free time to explore on your own. Amazed by the beauty of the Roman countryside, the coach drive to Civitavecchia concludes this full-day tour. *Please note: The cost of the lunch (optional) is not included in the price of the tour. Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. This tour is not available for guests on MSC Divina except on 09.06.2023 and for guests on MSC Poesia.*

SYRACUSE (Italy)

SIR01 – SYRACUSE AND ITS WONDERS ACROSS THE CENTURIES

Discover the extraordinary history of this magnificent town, one of the most important archaeological sites in Sicily, founded by the Greeks in 734 BC. Enjoying rapid growth from the moment of its foundation, Syracuse soon became one of the most powerful city-states in Sicily and the Mediterranean. The town resisted many

enemies but was eventually conquered by the Romans in 212 BC. After the fall of the Roman Empire, the Arabs, Normans and Aragonese occupied the city, leaving a rich architectural and cultural heritage over the centuries for you to explore. Departing from the pier by coach, you'll visit the awe-inspiring Neapolis Archaeological Park with its Roman Amphitheatre, Greek Theatre, Rope Makers' Cave, and extraordinary Ear of Dionysius cave, famous for its cascading echoes. We'll then continue by coach to the island of Ortygia for the second part of your walking tour. On Ortygia, we'll visit the ruins of the Temple of Apollo, then continue along Corso Matteotti, the main and most elegant shopping area. This will take us to Piazza Archimede with its splendid "Fountain of Diana or Artemis" and the Cathedral. This fascinating building comprises a series layers that were built up on each other over the ages, the oldest dating back to the 5th-century BC. Next to the Cathedral is the Abbey of Santa Lucia with its world-famous painting by Caravaggio. You'll then enjoy free time shopping in the large Cathedral Square and small streets around it. SIR02 – ROMANTIC TAORMINA, JEWEL OF SICILY



Duration: approx. 6 hours

This tour to enchanting Taormina takes you into the heart of the city for a full experience of its famous sites and panoramas. Leaving the port of Syracuse, we'll reach Taormina in around 90 minutes. A pleasant walk will take you to the renowned ancient Greco-Roman Theatre, built by the Greeks and then rebuilt by the Romans. You'll have an opportunity to admire the wonderful views before continuing to Palazzo Corvaja (outside visit), the 15th-century palace that was once the seat of the Sicilian Parliament. You'll also be able to visit the "Odeon" (outside visit), a small Roman theatre built for the elite of the city, and the unusual St. Nicholas Cathedral, dating back to the 13th-century. Concluding your exploration of this atmospheric city, you'll enjoy free time for shopping and further discoveries. *Please note: Visits to the Cathedral will be limited to the outside in the event of religious celebrations. Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. Guests are requested to wear appropriate attire for religious visits. Guests will be required to return their audio guide equipment to their tour guide in perfect condition at the end of the tour. SIR05 – MARVELS OF ETNA, SICILY'S VOLCANIC HEART AND ANCIENT TAORMINA



Duration: approx. 8 hours, lunch included

Explore Mount Etna, Europe's highest and most active volcano, thrilling to unforgettable views, and immerse yourself in the ancient splendours of beautiful Taormina on this exceptional full-day tour. Your day starts with a comfortable 2-hour coach trip from the port of Syracuse along the coast, up the Etna foothills and through the town of Zafferana Etnea, where you'll admire fantastic views across the mountains and to the sea. Just over half way up Mount Etna is the Rifugio Sapienza cableway station - twice buried under lava over the years - from where you'll reach the two inactive Silvestri Craters formed during the 1892 eruption. We'll pause here for awe-inspiring views and photo opportunities, including unforgettable panoramas across to the city of Catania. Leaving Etna, a 1-hour coach trip will take you to the lovely town of Taormina, where you'll savour a delicious lunch before taking a guided walking tour of the Greco-Roman theatre, 15th-century Palazzo Corvaja (outside visit), the Odeon - a small Roman theatre built for the elite of the city - and the unusual 13th-century St. Nicholas Cathedral. Proceeding through the city's atmospheric streets, we'll come to the unusual Cathedral (outside visit), which comprises a series of layers that were built up on each other over the ages, the oldest dating back to the 5th-century BC. Next to the Cathedral is the Abbey of Santa Lucia with its world-famous painting by Caravaggio. You'll then enjoy free time shopping in the large Cathedral Square and small streets around it, with plenty of opportunities to taste the exquisite sweets and pastries for which Sicily is renowned, including cannoli, granita, and brioches. SIR07 – WONDERS OF NOTO, CAPITAL OF SICILIAN BAROQUE**Duration: approx. 4 hours**

Discover the masterpieces of Sicilian Baroque art and architecture that have made Noto famous worldwide, completing your explorations with an experience of its heavenly traditional sweets and pastries. A comfortable coach trip will take you to Noto on the beautiful terraced slopes of Mount Iblei, among olive groves and almond trees. This exquisite Baroque town is a masterpiece of what was then novel urban planning on a grid system after the previous town on the left bank of the River Asinaro was destroyed by an earthquake in 1693. The new town located closer to the Ionian Sea benefited from the genius of architects such as Rosario Gagliardi and Francesco Sortino amongst others, who created a unique masterpiece of Sicilian Baroque recognised with UNESCO World Heritage Site status. Adding to the buildings' beauty, they are built of soft volcanic tufa stone which the sunlight gives a characteristic honey hue. Walking along its central streets, immersed in another time and another world, you'll be amazed by the constant succession of architectural gems, including the elegant 18th-century Palazzo Ducezio, now the Town Hall and many masterpieces of baroque church architecture, including Santa Chiara, San Francesco all'Immacolata, San Carlo Borromeo and Madonna del Carmine. Foremost among them was the Cathedral of San Nicolò, the dome of which suddenly collapsed in 1996 and was rebuilt in a complex restoration project completed in 2007. You'll also be able to admire the beauty of the imposing Palazzo Nicolaci di Villadorata, built in 1737 with balconies that are a masterful marriage of architecture and sculpture. Completing your discoveries, you'll be able to sample the art of Sicilian sweet making, savouring exquisite traditional granita with brioche or Sicilian cannoli in one of the many historic bars, accompanied by local Malvasia wine. You'll then have free time to explore on your own before our return to the port of Syracuse. *Please note: Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. Guests are requested to wear appropriate attire for religious visits. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. You'll pause here for awe-inspiring views and photo opportunities, including unforgettable panoramas across to the city of Catania. It is in this unique setting, at 1900 metres above sea level, that you will relax and enjoy an aperitif on a rooftop terrace while admiring the moonscape all around. An experience to remember and tell your friends about when you return home or to immortalise in a photograph if you love social media. Finally, it will be time to re-board the bus to return to Syracuse where the ship awaits you. *Please note: this tour is not suitable for guests with heart conditions due to the altitude reached or who have difficulty walking. In the event of adverse weather conditions, the tour programme will follow an alternative route which will be reconfirmed on board. We recommend wearing a windbreaker and comfortable shoes. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. Guests will be required to return their audio guide equipment to their tour guide in perfect condition at the end of the tour.
